Summary

As described in the March 14, 2017 Report to Priorities Committee, in celebration of Canada 150, Strathcona County will be marking the celebration locally. In addition to taking advantage of existing programming, such as Canada Day celebrations, new initiatives are being introduced to bring the occasion to life. Care is being taken to make these both meaningful, through local context, as well as memorable. While there will be Canada 150 activities throughout 2017, the bulk of programming will be focused during the summer months from June to August.

Grants have been applied for through Recreation Parks and Culture in relation to these activities; however, approval of grant funding is not certain. The use of the requested reserve funds will be reduced by the extent that related grant funds are received.
