Councillor Request Inquiry #139

Planning and Development Services engaged all three School Boards on the MDP update. We requested meetings with all three school boards to go over any of their concerns on the draft MDP update. EICS and Centre-Nord agreed to meet with PDS administration. Attached is a copy of the Memorandum dated March 14, 2017 to the EICS outlining their concerns and recommendations and how we will implement those comments into MDP Update. Also attached is the Memorandum dated March 14, 2017 to administration representatives from Centre-Nord, also outlining their concerns and recommendations and how we would implement those comments into the MDP Update.

We received an email from EIPS on January 23, 2017 requesting clarification on the Draft #1 of the MDP (email attached). Subsequent to this, on February 3, 2017 PDS received a letter (attached) from the office of the Board Chair expressing their concerns on the draft #1 of the MDP. PDS was not able to find a time that worked for EIPS to meet, however a meeting was ultimately arranged by EIPS with the Superintendent of EICS, the County Commissioner, the Associate Commissioner of Infrastructure, and the Director PDS on March 22, 2017. There was no formal agenda but a general discussion primarily on school site sizes, location of school sites and the challenges for both the school boards and the County with respect to new school facilities.

Based on the comments we received from the February 3, 2017 letter from the Board Chair, PDS addressed the comments and concerns where appropriate and recirculated the 2rd draft of the MDP update for their review. Attached is the letter dated **April 20, 2017** from the EIPS Superintendent stating that EIPS is pleased to see changes incorporated. They did express their ongoing concern regarding identification and availability of school sites in the County, however as this is not an MDP issue but an existing situation dealt with through the Site Allocation Committee, PDS moved forward with the MDP Update for Council's consideration.

We have committed to consult all three school boards at future planning stages when identifying future school sites. If you have any questions regarding the above, please do not hesitate to contact me at your earliest convenience.

	EICS recommends additional general policy direction be added regarding collaboration with school boards.	The following has been added to the draft MDP under Section 6 implementation:
1		Strathcona County will collaborate with school boards on the amount of, and allocation of, land for school sites and the identification of school requirements.
2	EICS recommends that additional consideration regarding the location of school sites and the phasing of new developments. School sites should be located in a phase of development that is supported by the proposed residential development within the same plan.	The following has been added to the relevant sections of the draft MDP: Strathcona County will consider the proposed location of school sites within neighbourhoods when establishing development phasing.
3	EICS does not support the construction of joint schools. Joint schools sites may be supported but should have access to at least three roads to ensure separate traffic lanes.	As the MDP is a high level policy document it does not speak specifically to joint schools or joint schools sites.

4	The most prominent concerns for EICS when planning a new school site are room to play and transportation. Generally schools within Strathcona County are getting larger.	The size and location of new school sites will be determined in lower level, site specific plans through collaboration with school boards. The MDP speaks generally to some location considerations that provide general guidance for school sites within new Area Structure Plans and Redevelopment Plans.
5	EICS supports the joint use and location of municipal facilities and schools.	The MDP policies encourage the joint use and location of municipal facilities and schools.

2	Centre-Nord's student population comes from a large area including parts of Edmonton. Due to this widespread student base, school sites that do not function well for other school boards may function well for Centre-Nord.	This information is useful to the County's future Planning.
3	The vast majority of Centre-Nord students will be bussed; therefore transportation is a primary concern.	The MDP speaks generally to some location considerations that provide general guidance for school sites within new Area Structure Plans and Redevelopment Plans. Transportation needs have been included within these considerations.

4	Centre-Nord is interested in collaboration with the County on the MDP implementation items regarding school sites and any other relevant future County projects.	Strathcona County values Centre- Nord's input regarding school sites and has added Centre-Nord to the County's general planning referral list.
5	Centre-Nord supports the joint use of municipal facilities and schools. The use of innovative mixed use school sites is exciting and interesting.	The MDP policies encourage the joint use of municipal facilities and schools as well as mixed use school sites.

Subject: Strathcona County Municipal Development Plan (File No. 4430-2017MDP001)

Elk Island Public Schools has appreciated the opportunity to review the draft Strathcona County Municipal Development Plan (File No. 4430-2017MDP001) and provide feedback.

We applaud the County for taking a proactive approach to planning, but at this time we wish to express significant concerns relative to some of the proposed recommendations.

First and foremost, duly elected school boards are given certain rights and responsibilities unto them as outlined in the *School Act*. There are several statements contained within the proposed MDP that appear to encroach on a Board's autonomy to make decisions that it is legally entitled to.

The following areas are of greatest concern:

- 1. The planning objectives as stated are very defined when it comes to school development. In many cases, the ideal conditions as set out may have significant cost implications for a Division and these costs may not be allowed by Alberta Education or Alberta Infrastructure.
- 2. Item 4.1.3.16 states: "Ensure the provision of services and open spaces for residents by requiring existing sites that have been identified as potential school sites under existing statutory plans be reviewed to determine their necessity and viability." This raises the question: Who will determine the necessity and viability of the school sites?

- 3. That adequate school reserve (SR) lands be dedicated, not mixed or multipurpose lands. This especially applies to high schools where large plots of SR are required.
- 4. The specific mention of high schools as a separate entity from schools and further defining where possible development may occur. The determination of a school configuration and its location relative to SR is the sole purview of a Board.
- 5. Requiring any future school development in certain areas to be located in the Urban Service Area or areas specified by the County.

If the intent of the MDP is to ensure that there is true collaboration amongst stakeholders as well as ensure that legislated autonomy be respected, we believe that there needs to be open and significant dialogue between School Boards and the County. We would welcome the opportunity to meet with the County as there are more questions raised than answers provided in the draft MDP.
