Smart Cities Challenge

Report Purpose

To provide information on the County's application to the federal Smart Cities Challenge.

Summary

The federal government has issued a "Smart Cities Challenge" with an application deadline of April 24, 2018. Finalists will be announced in the summer of 2018 and winners announced in spring 2019. Administration has created a team comprised of multiple departments to respond to the challenge. The team is supported by an external partner, Deloitte, who has helped several organizations successfully respond to other federal challenges. The prizes available will be one prize of up to \$50 million open to all communities, regardless of population; two prizes of up to \$10 million each to communities with populations under 500,000 people; and one prize of up to \$5 million open to all communities with populations under 30, 000 people. The challenge is one that defines the outcomes(s) which a community aims to achieve by implementing its "Smart Cities proposal." The project team plans to bring forward the application to Council at the April 10, 2018 meeting to request the letter of endorsement.

Development of the framework involved considerable community engagement, which is a key factor the federal government will use to evaluate successful bidders. The "smart "use of data and connected technology can help achieve the community outcomes of the Social Framework.
