Council History

November 10, 2015 – Priorities Committee was provided with an update on the Traffic Safety Strategic Plan.

September 9, 2014 – Council approved the updated Traffic Safety Strategic Plan 2020.

May 7, 2013 - Council received an update on Traffic Safety Strategic Plan.

June 26, 2012 - Council received an update on the Traffic Safety Strategic Plan.

July 6, 2008 – Council approved the Traffic Safety Strategic Plan.

November 7, 2006 – Council directed Administration to develop a Traffic Safety Strategic Plan for Strathcona County under the umbrella of the Strathcona County Strategic Plan. October 19, 2006 – Council received the Traffic Safety Committee's Final Report.

Strategic Plan Priority Areas

Economy: The economic impact of crashes is significant. It is estimated that in the last 10

years, traffic collisions cost our community over \$400 million in direct costs.

Governance: The plan will help guide traffic safety-related decisions.

Social: The social costs of traffic collisions cannot be overstated. Traffic safety is a key

component of a safe, caring community.

Summary

In 2014 the Traffic Safety Strategic Plan (TSSP) 2020 replaced the former TSSP 2008 as Strathcona County's guiding document for traffic safety decision-making. The plan is based on a "safer system" approach to traffic safety and sets out a vision, mission, and targets for traffic safety in the County. The Plan outlines 13 strategies to meet its targets. This update provides the current state of traffic safety in Strathcona County and progress towards strategies outlined in the TSSP 2020, and identifies priority projects for 2018.
