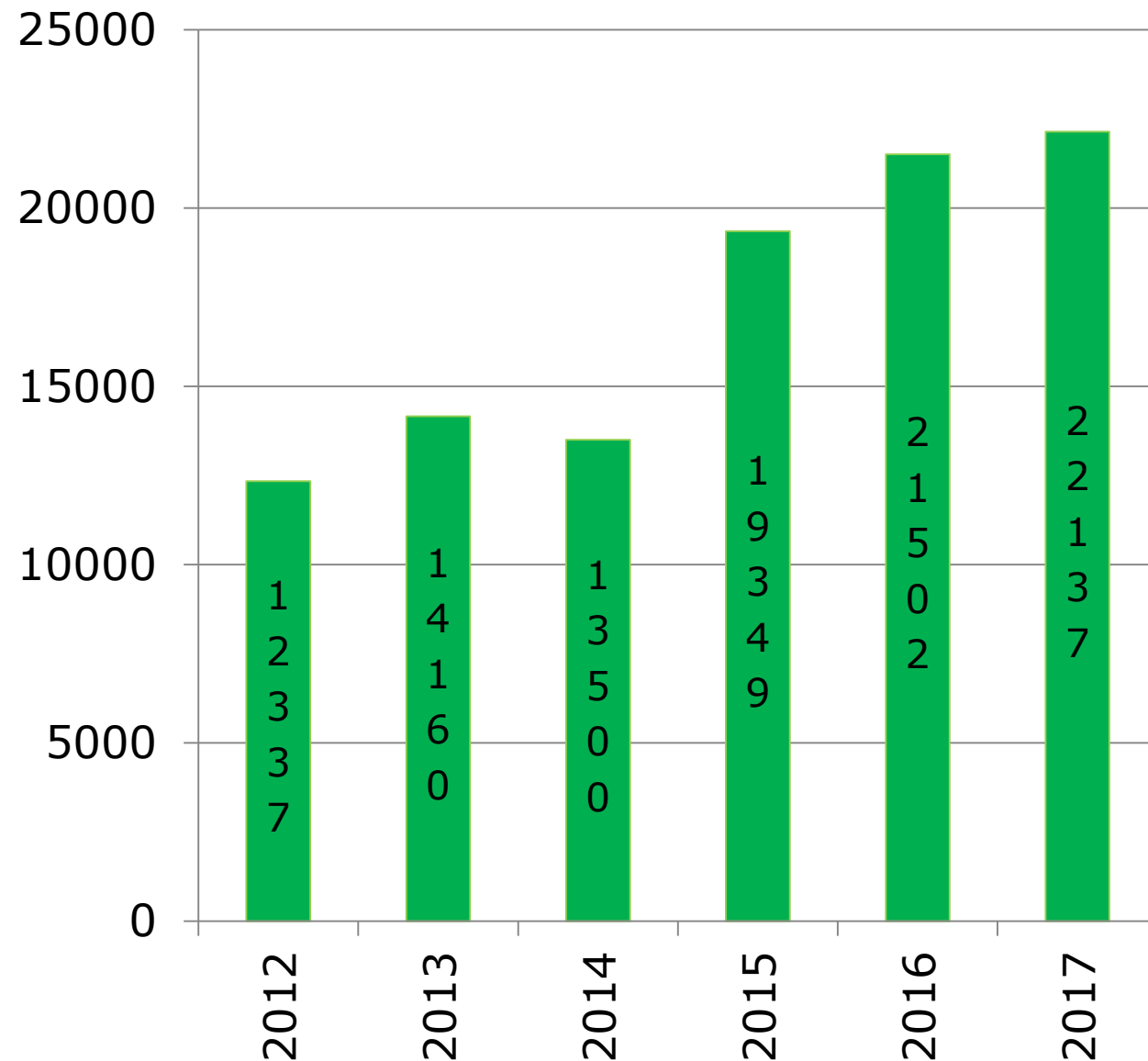

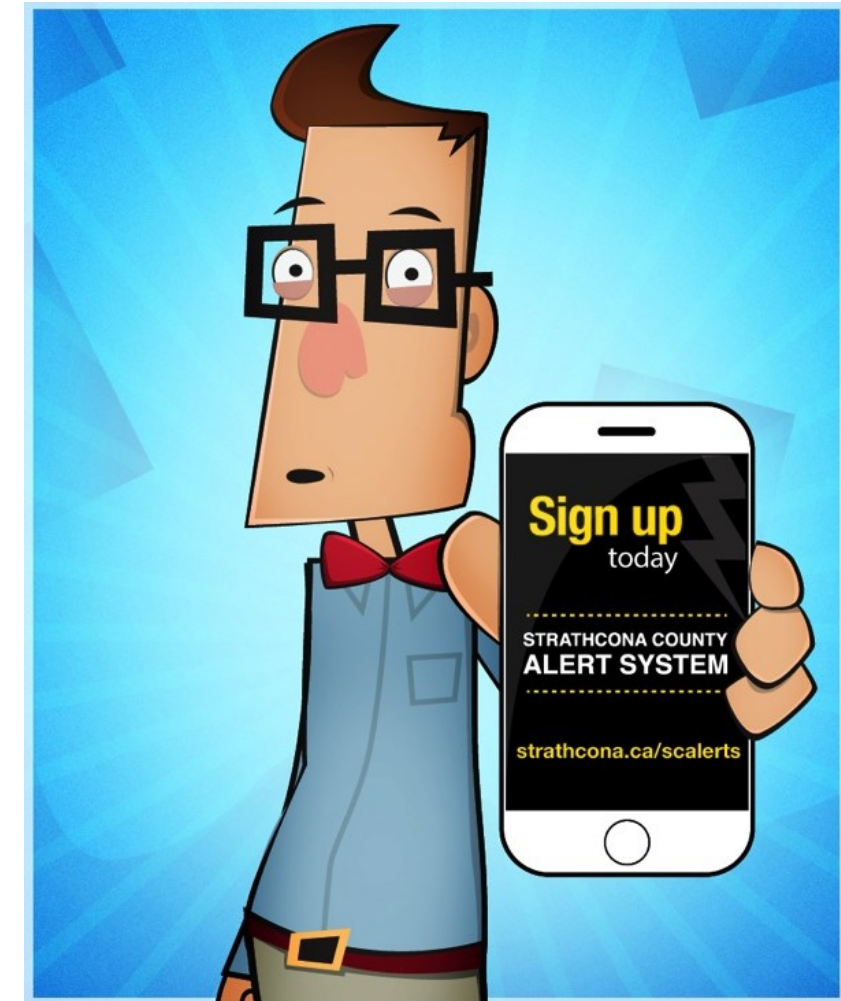


Strathcona County Alerts Registrations

35 Alerts were issued



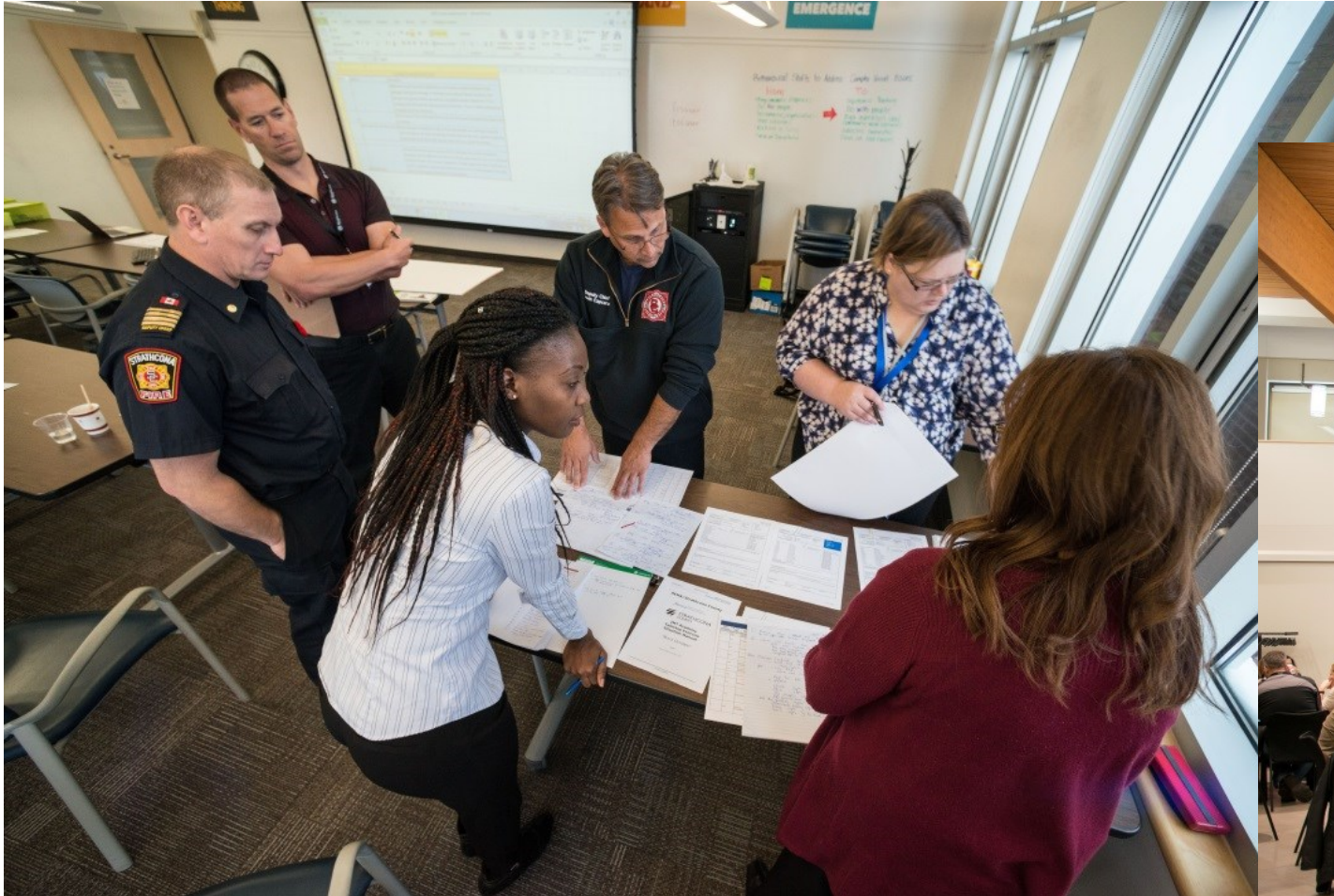

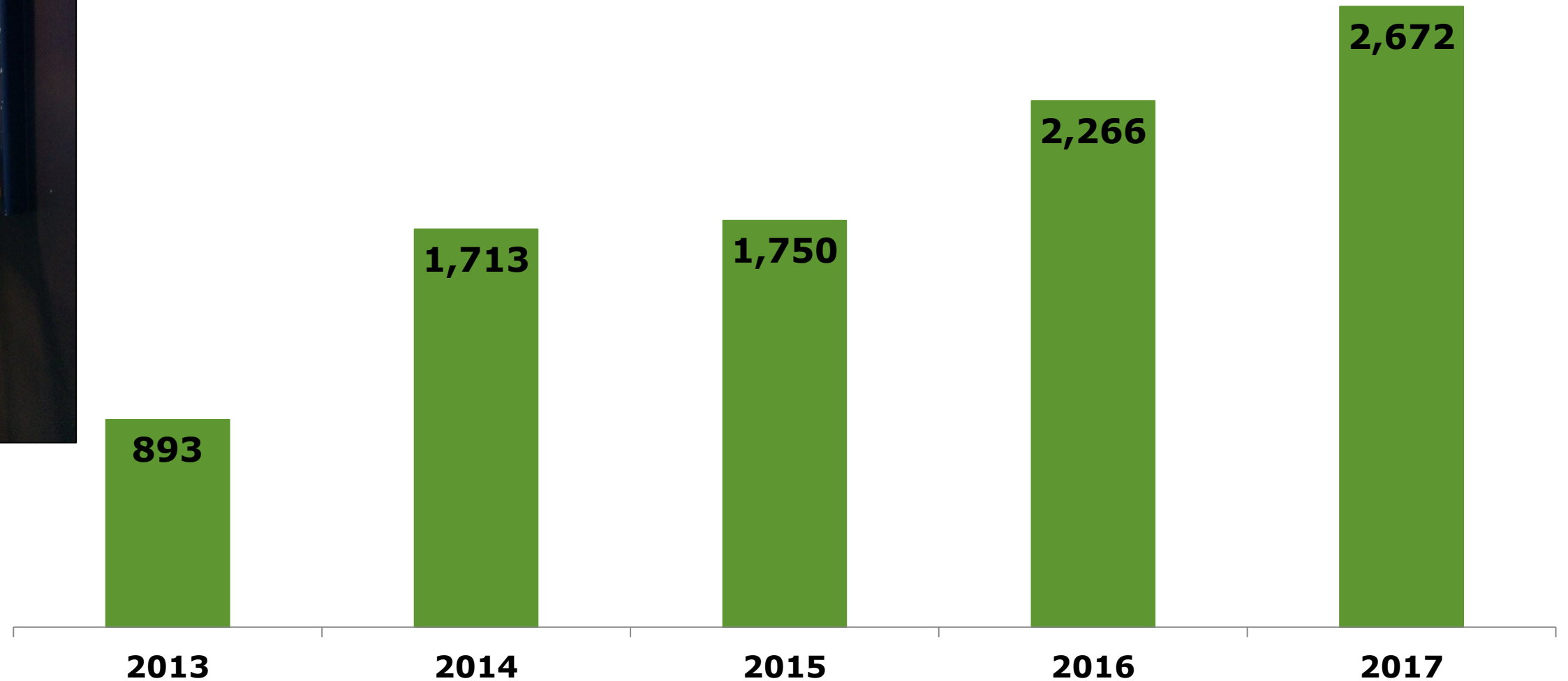

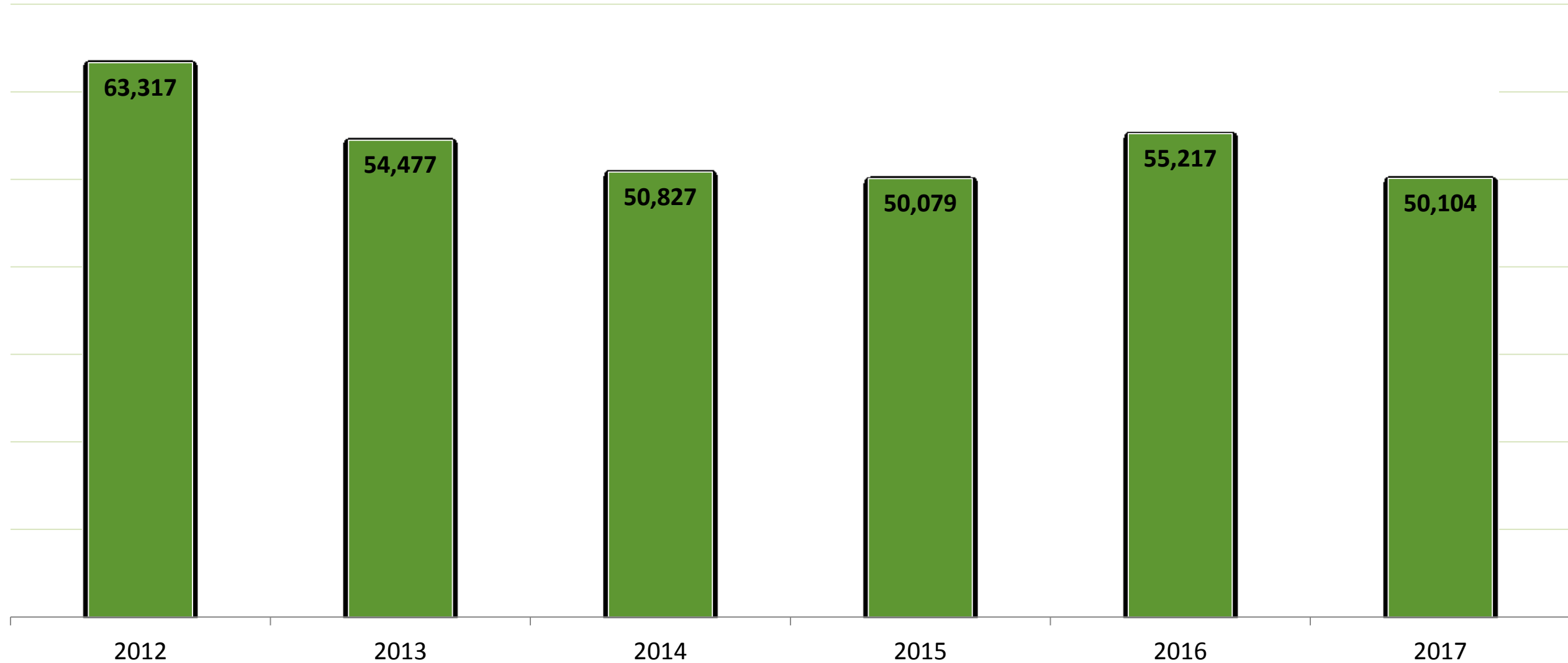

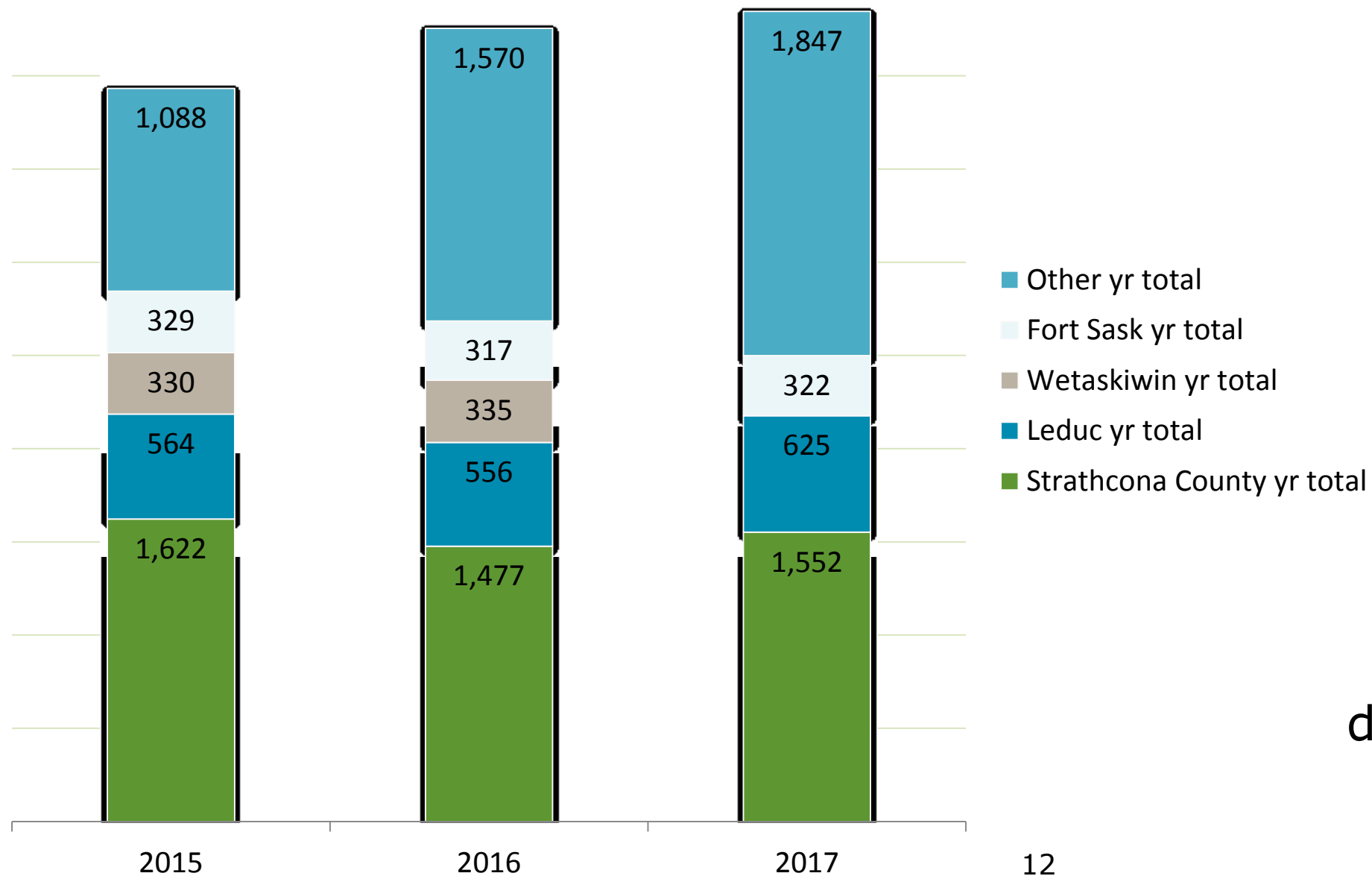

Total Events Dispatched

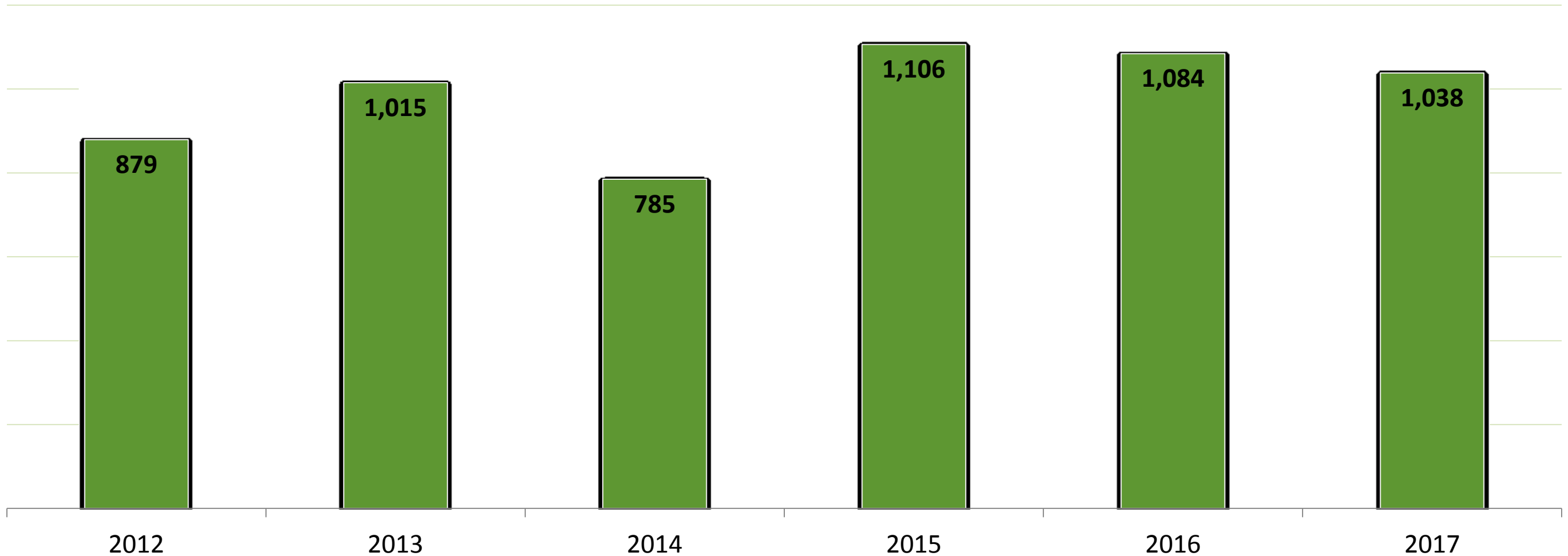

Fire Responses 2017

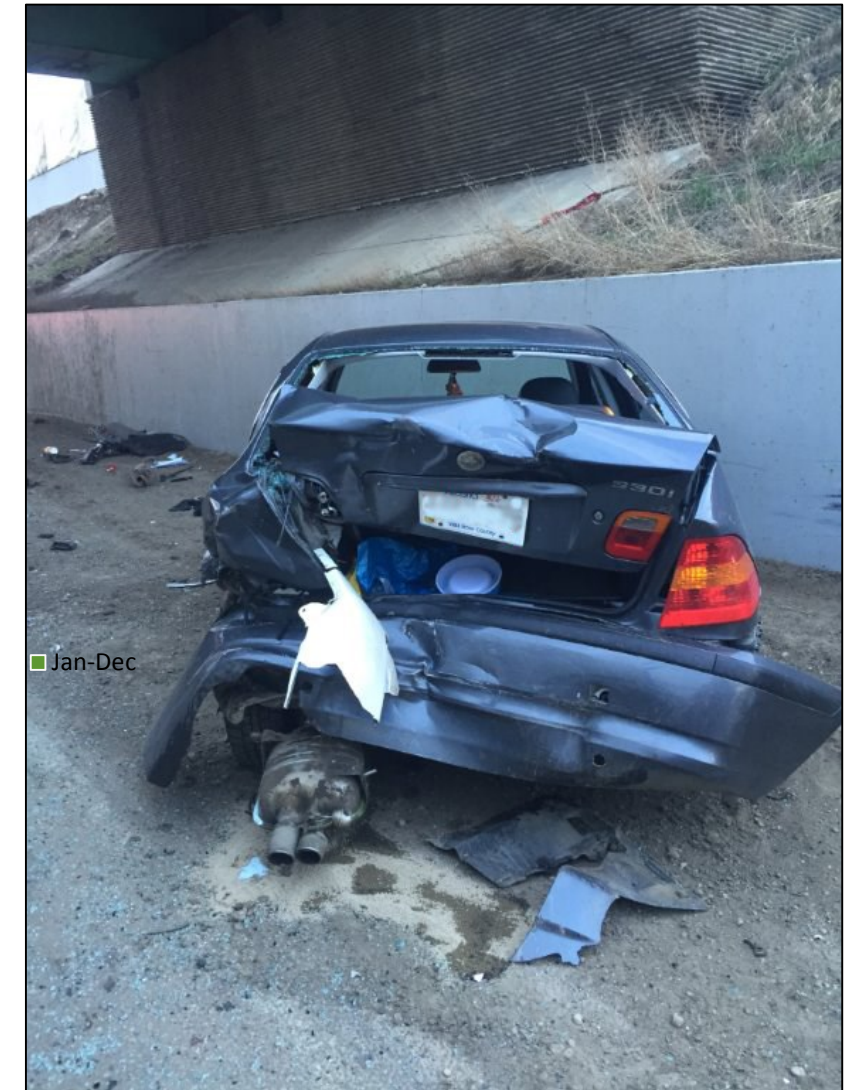
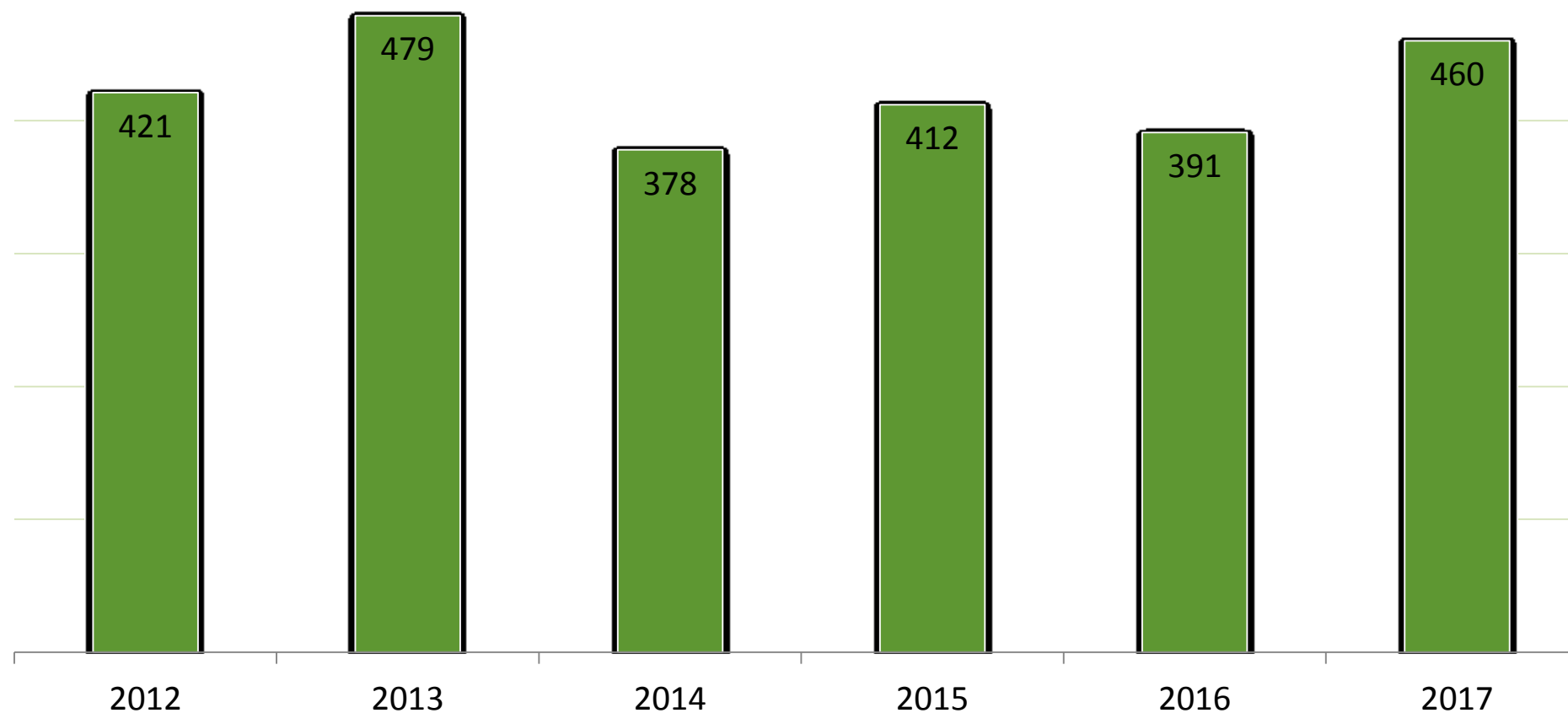

6741 EMS events that SCES responded to in 2017 within the region.

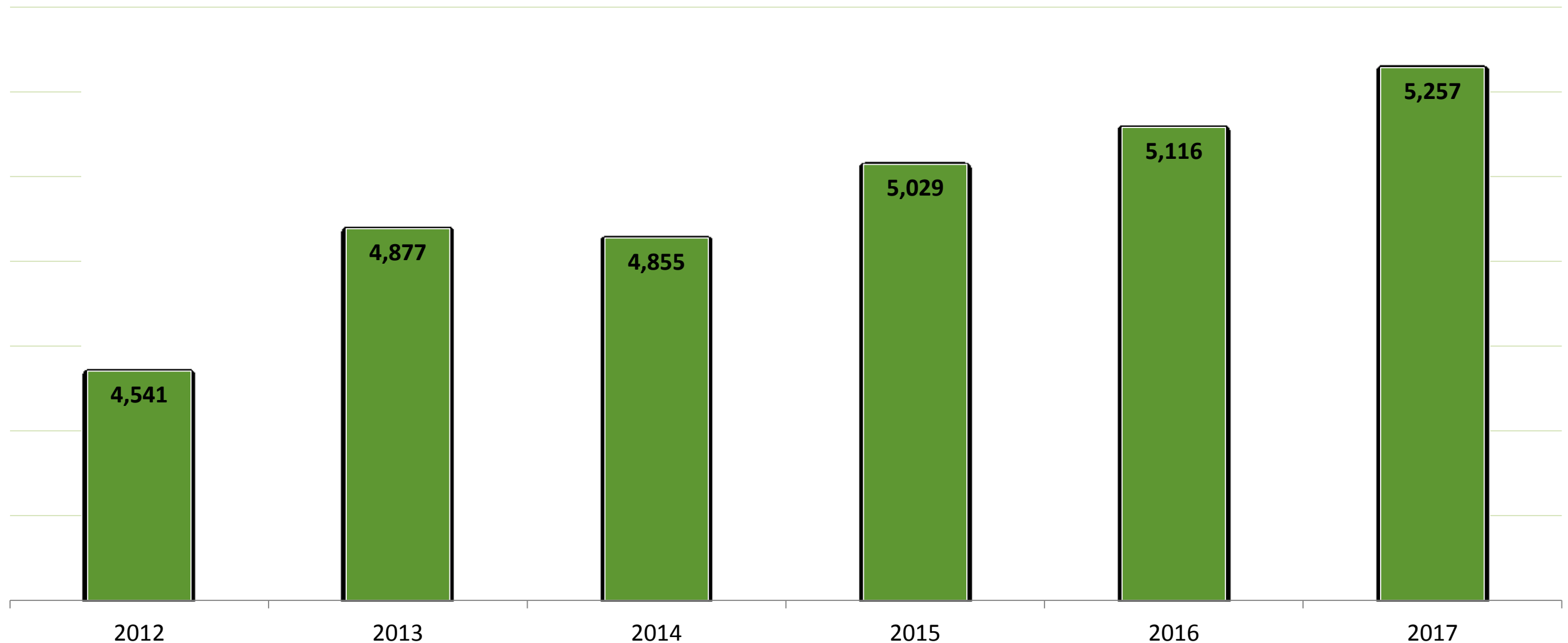

SCES attended 5257 of these events within Strathcona County (77.98%)



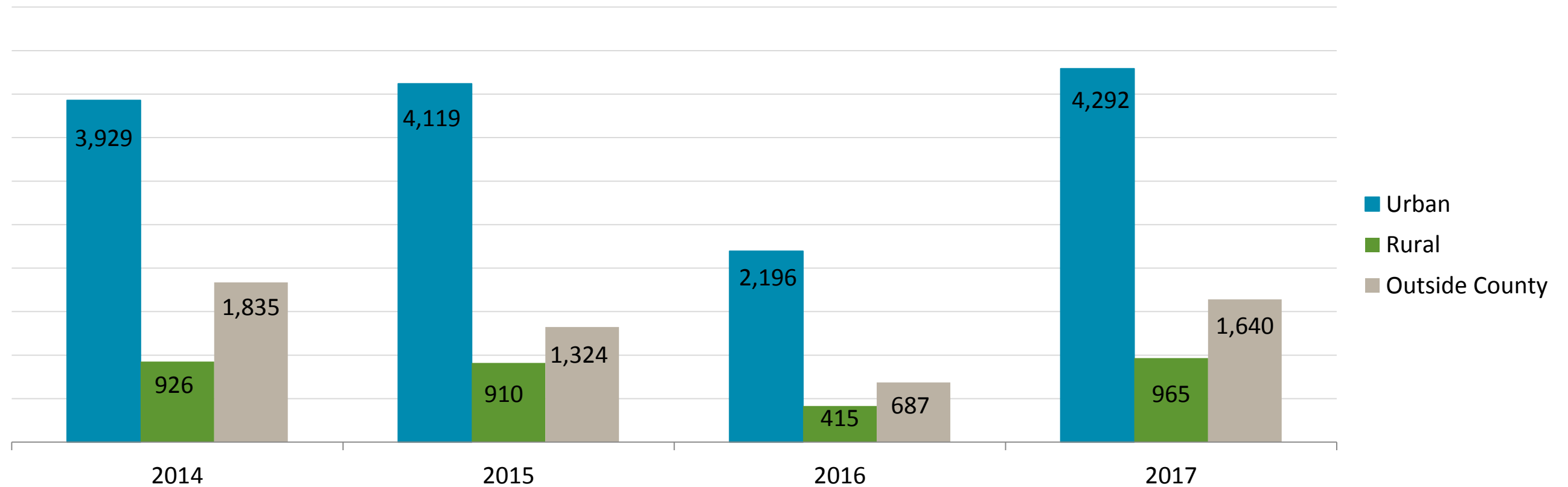
SCES EMS Events Within Strathcona County

EMS Events Response Locations

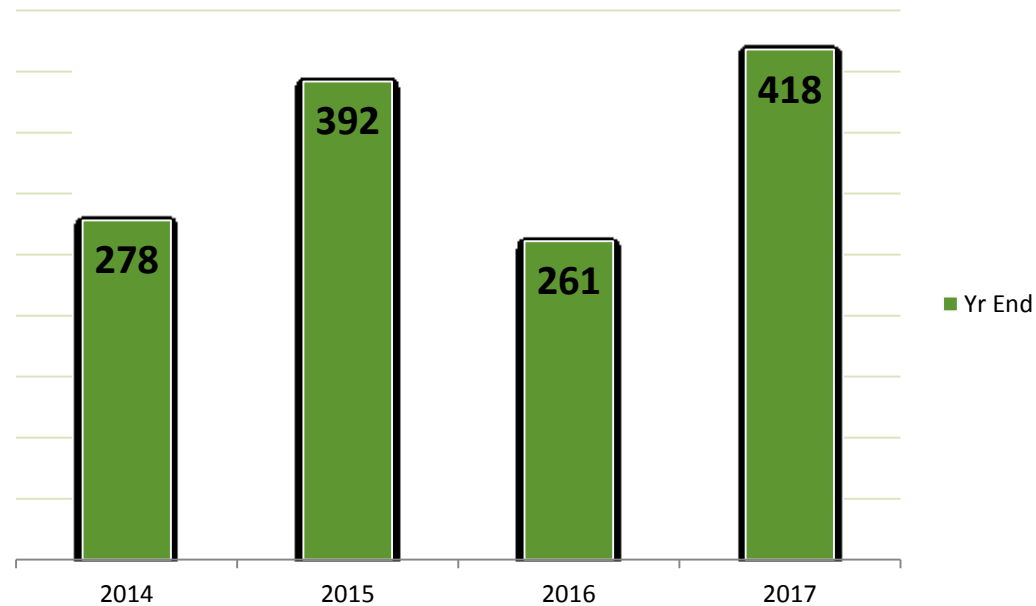
