Background

 Existing Social Services Grants Policy in place since 1985 with some revisions

 Approval of Social in Framework in 2017 was impetus for review of existing policy.



Policy Review Process

- Fall 2017: interviews with Councillors, community partners, nonprofit agencies, Family and Community Services (FCS) Advisory Committee members
- January 2018: Drafted renewed policy and guidelines
- February 2018: Draft policy and guidelines shared with 97 previous grant applicants for feedback and input
- February 2018: Two in-person engagement sessions; one with FCS Advisory Committee; one public session attended by community non-profit organizations.



Policy Purpose

- Support provision of prevention and early intervention strategies in Strathcona County
- Align grant funding to the Social Framework outcomes and shifts in thinking
- Provide a range of funding to enable groups from grassroots to nonprofit organizations to implement the Social Framework
- Support collective learning on how to better work together towards positive community and system change.



Three Funding Streams



- Core social funding
 - To support the social non-profit sector to provide prevention and early intervention supports for social needs and contribute to the Social Framework outcomes
- Collaboration funding
 - To mobilize cross-sector partnerships and collective resources to address community-wide social issues
- Community seed funding
 - To promote innovative, creative projects and ideas that bring people together around opportunities in a community or neighbourhood for positive change



What is Different?

NEW...

- Alignment with 2017 Social Framework outcomes and shifts in thinking
- Core funding of 1-3 years
- Active collaboration between organizations for periods of 2-3 years
- Seed funding to broader grassroots groups for creative projects in line with the framework and funds to increase community connections
- Transparent decision-making processes and competency-based governance



Governance and Decision Making

CURRENT STATE

- FCS Advisory Committee is an Administrative Committee advisory to FCS
- Outdated terms of reference, members appointed by Director of FCS
- FCS Advisory Committee reviews and recommends applications for funding
- Recommendations through FCS to Council for decision
- Community small grants not included in the current Social Services Grants policy; grant decisions made by FCS Advisory Committee.



Governance and Decision Making

PROPOSED FUTURE STATE

- The Social Framework Community Grants Advisory Committee remains an administrative committee
- Transparent, competency based selection of members by group made up of administration and community members
- The Social Framework Community Grants Advisory Committee reviews and recommends applications for funding to administration
- Grant allocation recommendations are presented to Council for final decision and approval
- Community seed funding(< \$2000/grant) decisions made by FCS administration
