Introduction

Council Motion Jan 23, 2018

Council approved “THAT Administration prepare a bylaw, for Council’s consideration by the third quarter of 2018, in order to establish a Council committee titled Traffic Safety Advisory Committee (TSAC); this committee is to be comprised of non-voting Council members (one member and one alternate), as well as up to seven members of the public (at least two members to be rural representatives), with administrative support provided by Enforcement Services and Transportation Planning and Engineering; this committee’s terms of reference is to include advising Council on local and rural area traffic concerns and solutions, as well as suggestions for soliciting feedback from the public on traffic safety issues.”

- Recommend traffic safety issues that could benefit from public engagement.
- Provide advice on the development and implementation of traffic safety and efficiency initiatives currently underway in Strathcona County.
- Review and discuss the development of the Rural Road Safety Strategy.
- Review and discuss the development of the Traffic Safety Communication Plan.
- Review and discuss the implementation of the Neighbourhood Traffic Safety Action Plan.

- January 2019 – recruitment of public members for the committee
- March 2019 – recommended appointments provided to Council for approval
- April - June 2019 – first committee meeting and orientation takes place
