# Recycling Program History and Results to-date

## 1992 - Tires

- 113 million tires recycled



## 2004 - Electronics

- Nine million units recycled



## 2008 - Paint

- 22.7 million litres recycled
- 4.5 million aerosol cans recycled



## 2018 - Used Oil Materials

- Program transitioned to Alberta Recycling on October 1st. Recycled since 1997:
  - 1.6 billion litres of oil
  - 139 million oil filters; 35 million kgs of plastic oil containers

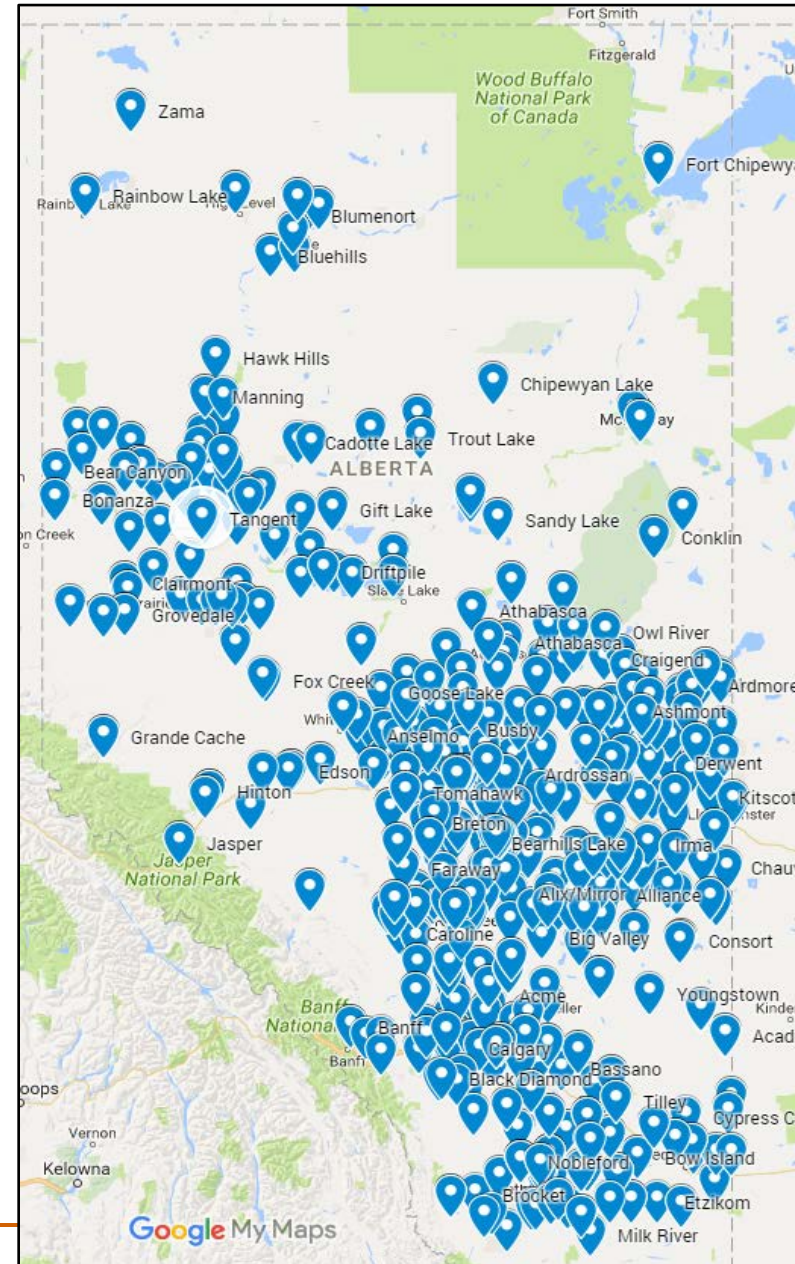




# Key to the Programs' success

## ❑ Municipalities and Indigenous Communities

- ❑ Provide a combined total of 452 registered electronics, paint and tire collection sites
- ❑ 96% of Albertans live within a 20 minute drive of a collection site

# We recognize the vital work of collection sites

- Annual Awards of Excellence
  - Initiated in October 2008
  - Distinguish the outstanding efforts of three collection sites.
- Awards based on population served
  - Small < 5,000 **Saddle Hills County Transfer Stations**
  - Medium 5,000 – 25,000 **Sylvan Lake Transfer Station**
  - Large > 25,000 **BROADVIEW ENVIROSERVICE STATION**

# What it takes to become a winner

- Sites are registered with the Electronics, Paint and Tire Recycling Programs (*Used Oil site registration to be developed over time*)
  - ❑ Our Field Services Inspector annually visits every collection site to confirm compliance to Collection Site Requirements
  - ❑ Snapshot of requirements:
    - Safe, proper handling and storage of Program material
      - ❑ Examples: maximize capacity of paint bins; perform unit counts of electronics; tire marshalling area clean of debris
    - Sites are convenient and accessible to the public
      - ❑ Example: having Program signage in place
    - Submit paperwork on time to Alberta Recycling
      - ❑ \$130/tonne in grant funding for electronics and paint (separate grant funding for tires)
  - ❑ Winning sites are chosen based on final field reports
