#### Summary

Administration regularly reviews its Winter Maintenance Policy with Council to ensure it effectively addresses snow clearing needs as the community grows and changes. The policy is based on a priority system which classifies road types in the rural and urban service areas. The priority classification (Priority 1-4) determines the level of service applied to the roads based on snow accumulation.

Additions and amendments were made to the policy in 2011 and again in 2013 to address large snowfalls in a short timeline.

Snowfall accumulations after 2014 have been minimal and snow removal on Priority 3 and Priority 4 roads in Sherwood Park were not required until the 2017-18 season. In January and February 2018, we met criteria to clear snow routes and residential streets, respectively.
