## **Environmental Advisory Committee Update**

## January 2018 – November 2018

The Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC) last provided a Report for Information to Council November 21, 2017 to report on their activities for 2017. The EAC met a total of four times from January 2018 to November 2018, with a fifth meeting expected before the end of 2018. The EAC has been focused on addressing the items listed in their mandate letter. However the Committee would also like to advise Priorities Committee that a report will be coming forward to Council for approval to add other items to their mandate letter.

The Environmental Advisory Committee also expressed interest in other topics outside of the scope of the mandate letter including air quality and recycling.

The committee received a presentation from the Alberta Capital Airshed where they learned about airsheds, air quality, and monitoring efforts. The committee was especially interested in Clean Air Day and other similar education campaigns that the County participates in. With this in mind, the EAC would like to express a desire to add an activity to the mandate letter regarding the review and promotion of environment initiative days; a report will be coming forward to Council for approval. The possibility of an anti-idling bylaw was also discussed. However the Committee feels that an education campaign would be more effective and a better use of resources.

In 2017, Administration was tasked by Council to work with the EAC with regards to improving textile reuse in Strathcona County. The committee was particularly interested in receiving updates regarding this initiative as well as the recent changes to the Green Routine system. While Utilities was unable to attend an EAC meeting, they did provide updates to the Committee regarding the textile task and recycling in general. The committee would like to express their support for Strathcona County participating in The Last Straw Campaign in future years, as well as exploring a plastic bag ban or related initiatives to reducing plastic consumption and resources in the County. Issues surrounding waste, recycling, and public awareness were frequently discussed during the roundtable portions of the Committee meetings, as well as in offline email conversations.

The chair attended Eli Mina Consulting's Effective Meetings Workshop on February 21 and was grateful to be able to apply her learnings to the Environmental Advisory Committee. Members of the EAC participated in public consultation for the Transit Master Plan as individuals and were able to bring their perspective and feedback back to the larger group. One of the public members of the EAC resigned from the Committee in September.
