2019 Social Framework Grants Recommendations

- Move from fragmented service delivery to integrated, aligned and strategic efforts that implement the Social Framework.
- In accordance with the Social Framework Community Grants Policy SER-005-001, the Strathcona County Social Framework Community Grants Advisory Committee submits the following recommendations for grants funding allocations for 2019.

Three Funding Streams



- Core Social Funding (1-3 Years)
 - To support the non-profit sector to provide prevention and early intervention supports for social needs and contribute to the Social Framework outcomes and behavioural shifts
- Collaboration Funding (1-3 Years)
 - To mobilize cross-sector partnerships and collective resources to address community-wide issues
- Community Seed Funding (1 Year or Less)
 - To promote innovative, creative projects and ideas that bring people together around current opportunities in a community or neighbourhood for positive change

Social Framework Community Grants Process

- Nov-Dec 2018**
- grant applications received (07-Nov)
 - review of applications by Family and Community Services and by Community Social Framework Grants Advisory Committee
- Feb 2019**
- grant recommendations presented to Council (05-Feb)

Social Framework Community Grants Advisory Committee

- Members have been recruited through an open and transparent process, from a pool of highly qualified applicants living in Strathcona County.
