PART 9 COMPANY (Pioneer Housing Foundation)

- Incorporated pursuant to Companies Act
- 'Not-for-profit' profits used for the purpose of providing housing and not paid to members




MANAGEMENT BODY (Heartland Housing Foundation)

- Established by Minister under Alberta Housing Act
- Ability to requisition the municipalities
- Management Body Operation and Administration Regulation




