Bremner Heritage Site Master Plan Update

Report Purpose

To provide Priorities Committee with the strategic direction that Administration will continue to pursue in regards to the Bremner Heritage Site Master Plan.

Our Prioritized Strategic Goals

Goal 2 - Manage, invest and plan for sustainable municipal infrastructure

Goal 7 - Provide opportunities for public engagement and communication

Report

In 2004, Strathcona County purchased the Bremner Heritage Site with the intent to develop a historical and educational resource. To further this goal, the Bremner Heritage Site Master Plan was developed and accepted by Council in 2009. The purpose of this Master Plan was to provide guidance for the development of the Heritage Site by identifying key elements and themes to outline potential programming, activities and uses for the site. The plan highlighted the potential to become a Legacy Site, with a focus on agricultural heritage and growing into a community gathering space.

The development of this plan involved public engagement which included:

- Interviews and a workshop with key stakeholders
- Formal meetings/presentations

Following the acceptance of the Bremner Heritage Site Master Plan, implementation proceeded slowly. Primarily, work was done to restore the outside of the main house which was completed in 2012.

In 2014, the Agriculture Services branch moved to the property and reinvigorated the site, following the Master Plan's guidance on landscaping and designing open outdoor space.

In 2015, Council directed the Agricultural Service Board to take over the stewardship of the Bremner Heritage Site Master Plan.

In 2016, Council chose the Bremner Heritage Site and adjacent lands as the location for the Multi-Purpose Agricultural Facility. The vision of the Multi-Purpose Agriculture Facility purposefully includes the original intent of the Bremner Heritage Site, with agricultural heritage as one of the guiding principles for the project.

The Bremner Heritage Site Master Plan is now ten years old and needs to be revisited. Working from the approved key elements and themes that already exist within the Master Plan, recommendations out of a Revised Master Plan will seek to identify synergies and a single, cooperative path forward between the Multi-Purpose Agricultural Facility and the Bremner Heritage Site.

The Agricultural Service Board supports this approach and passed a motion at the January 16, 2019 Agricultural Service Board meeting, THAT the Bremner Heritage Site Master Plan continue to maintain agricultural education heritage as its focus. As the Agricultural Service
