

Bylaw 30-2019 amendment to Rural Hamlet Boundaries Bylaw 40-2009 (Ward 5)

Report Purpose

To provide information to Council to make a decision on first, second and third readings of a bylaw that proposes to amend the Rural Hamlet Boundaries Bylaw 40-2009 to incorporate approximately 106 hectares (262 acres) of land in the NE 2-53-22-W4 and part of SE 2-53-22-W4 into the Hamlet of Ardrossan boundary.

Recommendations

- 1. THAT Bylaw 30-2019, a bylaw that proposes to amend the Rural Hamlet Boundaries Bylaw 40-2009 to incorporate approximately 106 hectares (262 acres) of land in the NE 2-53-22-W4 and part of SE 2-53-22-W4 into the Hamlet of Ardrossan boundary, be given first reading.
- 2. THAT Bylaw 30-2019 be given second reading.
- 3. THAT Bylaw 30-2019 be considered for third reading.
- 4. THAT Bylaw 30-2019 be given third reading.

Report

The purpose of the Rural Hamlet Boundary Bylaw is to provide a record that clearly defines the eight rural hamlet boundaries contained within Strathcona County.

The proposed amendment to the Rural Hamlet Boundary Bylaw is a result of concurrent Bylaw 22-2019 to amend Municipal Development Plan (MDP) Bylaw 20-2017 to incorporate approximately 106 hectares (262 acres) of land in the NE 2-53-22-W4 and part of SE 2-53-22-W4 into the Hamlet of Ardrossan boundary. Should Council adopt proposed Bylaw 22-2019 to amend the MDP, this subsequent amendment to the Rural Hamlet Boundary Bylaw 40-2009 would ensure consistency between the two Bylaws.

Council and Committee History

August 27, 2013 Council adopted Bylaw 40-2013, a bylaw that proposed to amend Bylaw 40-2009 to expand the boundary of the hamlet of South Cooking Lake.

June 30, 2009 Council adopted Rural Hamlet Boundary Bylaw 40-2009.

Other Impacts

Legislative/Legal: Section 59(1) of the *Municipal Government Act* provides that the Council of a district or specialized municipality may designate an unincorporated community that is within its boundaries to be a hamlet.

Master Plan/Framework: MDP Bylaw 20-2017 identifies the boundaries of the hamlets with rural Strathcona County.
