M.E.D.D. X– Motivational Experiences/Education for X- Drug Dealers Program

- Allows an opportunity for education, open respectful communication and healing to begin;
- Provides awareness to the X-Drug dealer on the negative impact of that lifestyle for families including their own and the community
- Partners Edmonton Drug Treatment Court and Justice and Solicitor General
- Referral based and approved by collaborative agreement (PEP program manager and partners)
