Seniors in Strathcona County

- Percentage of seniors increased from 5.5% to 14% of total population from 1996 to 2016
- Seniors population increased by 35% from 2011-2016
- 1 in 5 Albertans will be a senior in 15 years
- Proportion of seniors over age 75 is 40% in Sherwood Park and 30% in rural areas
- 2 of 10 seniors in Sherwood Park is a single senior compared to 1 in 10 in rural Strathcona County
- Highest proportion of seniors reside in Ward 1 (1 of 4 residents)
