# **Community Hub - A Report on Wellness**

#### **Report Purpose**

To provide an update to the Priorities Committee on the findings from the 2019 community hub engagement.

#### **Our Prioritized Strategic Goals**

- Goal 1 Build strong communities to support the diverse needs of residents
- Goal 5 Foster collaboration through regional, community and governmental partnerships
- Goal 6 Provide facilities and services that are available and accessible to residents

## Report

Community hubs are spaces where citizens can access multiple and diverse supports that enhance their holistic wellbeing.

In 2018, Strathcona County commissioned the Community Hub Study to examine the potential for the creation of a community hub for Strathcona County. The project researched community hubs across Canada to gain insights as to how Strathcona County could approach the design and implementation of a community hub and engaged stakeholders and residents on their perspectives. The report identified broader public engagement, partner exploration, business planning and possible site exploration as potential next steps for the project.

In December 2018, Council approved \$70,000 in the 2019 budget to conduct further public engagement around the concept of a community hub.

Throughout the spring and summer of 2019, Family and Community Services planned and implemented public engagement around the community hub initiative in three ways:

- 1. Community engagement: Connecting with residents of Strathcona County on the theme of wellness as a focus for a universal community hub.
- 2. Research into best practices: Conversations with existing community hubs to glean practical insights on the evolution, purpose, and contributions of relevant community hubs.
- 3. Partnership development: Exploring the connection of this work with Recreation, Parks and Culture's Recreation and Culture Strategy and implementation.

The enclosed report provides an update on the 2019 community hub engagement activities and findings.
