Multi-Sport Indoor Field Update

Report Purpose

To provide the Priorities Committee with an update on the multi-sport indoor field project.

Report

In October of 2018, the Sherwood Park District Soccer Association presented a report to Priorities Committee proposing the need for an indoor full-size, non-boarded turf field. Following this presentation, on December 6, 2018, Council passed a motion for administration to move ahead on the design of a multi-sport field (dome).

Since the motion passed, administration has been developing a plan for this design, and it includes the following elements: community needs assessment and stakeholder engagement, site analysis, construction method evaluation and functional areas with the facility, and operating and capital budget estimates.

Administration will review the listed elements and provide options for the consideration of the next phase of the planning process.
