Youth Needs and Assets Assessment – Final Report

Report Purpose

To provide Priorities Committee with the final report from the Youth Needs and Assets Assessment.

Our Prioritized Strategic Goals

Goal 1 - Build strong communities to support the diverse needs of residents Goal 5 - Foster collaboration through regional, community and governmental partnerships Goal 2 - Manage, invest and plan for sustainable municipal infrastructure

Report

In response to a motion from Council, the Youth Needs and Assets Assessment (YNAA) was initiated to explore the needs and opportunities for youth and young adults, ages 14-29, in Strathcona County. The project included a literature review and online scan, statistical profile, services directory, and public engagement, culminating in a final report with recommendations on how to support youth and young adults to thrive in the community. Yardstick Research was commissioned to lead the project, guided by a project committee composed of community partners and departments within Strathcona County.

Work on the project was initiated in January 2019, with public engagement taking place from May to August 2019 through online surveys, onsite/intercept engagement, and focus groups. Feedback was provided by 41 agency representatives, approximately 900 youth and young adults, and over 200 parents. Results of the engagement can be found in Enclosure 2.

Through this holistic review and community engagement, Yardstick Research concluded that Strathcona County is a community that actively comes together to support youth and young adults, and there is room to improve. All recommendations were founded on the collective commitment that *Youth feel connected, included and supported and access a range of programs and services that meet their needs without having to leave Strathcona County.*

Key themes that emerged through the research and engagement included recommendations around communication, engagement, mental health, gathering spaces, transportation, and affordability. Through these themes, the overarching recommendation emerged *To create a community-led, collaborative strategy to guide implementation of recommendations, including youth and young adult representation.* The full list of recommendations, along with the complete report, can be found in Enclosure 2.
