Bottom line

Strathcona County's community gardens are permitted to operate subject to participants following Alberta Health Services restrictions on gatherings and physical distancing.

Details

- The opening of community gardens was paused temporarily in April to align with the closure of Strathcona County parks and playgrounds.
- The province clarified that community gardens are permitted to operate if they follow AHS restrictions. This information was shared with garden groups on April 17.
- Operating guidelines that outline AHS restrictions, along with updated garden licence agreements, will be shared and discussed with garden leaders for further input.
- Garden groups will be permitted to open after the updated licence agreements and operating guidelines are in place. This date will vary for each group, but we anticipate it will be around the May long weekend.
- As this situation with COVID-19 is changing rapidly, Strathcona County will let garden groups know that, although our current plan is to open community gardens, this may change based on guidance from Alberta Health Services.
