Introduction

The Recovery Governance Task Force Workplan outlines and guides the implementation of developing governance-related recommendations for the municipality's response, recovery and resilience both during and after COVID-19. The Task Force is responsible for creating an overall vision and strategy with a focus on regional cooperation and advocating to other orders of government for municipal supports to address recovery in the short, medium and long-term future.

The Task Force is committed to exploring and learning through collaboration and cooperation with regional partners and other orders of government and, advocating for the needs of our community. Their work aligns with three of **Council's Strategic Plan Goals**:



To achieve their mandate the Task Force has identified four areas of focus and associated priorities to further their understanding of recovery and resilience barriers and opportunities and, support the development of recommendations that will strengthen and advance the municipality's governance efforts and its continued pursuit of the County's long-term vision of *"Becoming Canada's Most Livable Community"*.
