Report

At the September 24, 2019 meeting, Council directed administration to establish a Task Force with a mandate to review the current departmental operations with a view to improving the permitting process. Council directed administration to focus on increasing efficiencies in order to improve the County's business climate.

Provided that Council is satisfied with the proposed bylaw and membership, then Council may give the bylaw the required readings in order to establish the Task Force as well as approving a motion to appoint the members of the Task Force.

Council and Committee History

September 24, 2019

Council approved the following motion: THAT Administration prepare a report identifying opportunities for red tape reduction with a goal of streamlining departmental operations and increasing efficiencies in order to improve the business climate within Strathcona County with consideration given to:

- streamlining the permitting process;
- reviewing departmental policies that create bottlenecks;
- striking a task force that includes members of the Chamber of Commerce and the Urban Development Institute to identify opportunities for red tape reduction; and

reporting back to council by the end of the second quarter of 2020.

Legislative/Legal: Section 145(b) of the Municipal Government Act (MGA) provides that a council may pass bylaws in relation to the procedure and conduct of council, council committees, and other bodies established by the council, the conduct of councillors and the conduct of members of council committees and other bodies established by council. Section 203(1) of the MGA provides that Council may, by bylaw, delegate certain powers, duties or functions to a council committee.
