

Bylaw 3-2020 map amendment to Municipal Development Plan Bylaw 20-2017 (Ward 3) (second and third readings)

Report Purpose

To provide information to Council to make a decision on second and third readings of Bylaw 3-2020 that proposes to amend Municipal Development Plan (MDP) Bylaw 20-2017 to re-designate Plan 6133MC, Lot A from the Commercial Policy Area to the Urban Centre Policy Area.

Recommendations

- 1. THAT Bylaw 3-2020, a bylaw that proposes to amend MDP Bylaw 20-2017 to redesignate Plan 6133MC, Lot A from the Commercial Policy Area to the Urban Centre Policy Area, be given second reading.
- 2. THAT Bylaw 3-2020 be given third reading.

Report

The purpose of proposed Bylaw 3-2020 is to amend MDP Bylaw 20-2017 to re-designate Plan 6133MC, Lot A from the Commercial Policy Area to the Urban Centre Policy Area.

The parcel's existing commercial development, direct access to Brentwood Boulevard and location contiguous to the Urban Centre Policy Area provide an excellent opportunity for the type of redevelopment supported under the Urban Centre Policy Area.

The parcel has been included in the proposed Centre in the Park (CITP) Area Redevelopment Plan (ARP) Bylaw 1-2020 that was drafted under the policy direction of the Urban Centre Policy Area.

Other Impacts

Policy: The MDP Bylaw 20-2017 requires an area redevelopment plan and supporting technical documents for the Urban Centre Policy Area.

Legislative/Legal: The *Municipal Government Act* (*MGA*) provides that Council may, by bylaw, amend the MDP. The *MGA* provides that an ARP must be consistent with any municipal development plan.

Interdepartmental: Multiple Strathcona County departments are involved in the CITP ARP update project through inter-departmental technical advisory.

Master Plan/Framework: The proposed MDP amendment has been prepared in accordance with the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Growth Plan.
