

Bylaw 11-2021 map amendment to Land Use Bylaw 6-2015 (Ward 5)

Report Purpose

To provide information to Council to make a decision on first and second reading of a bylaw that proposes to amend Land Use Bylaw 6-2015 to rezone approximately 5.49 hectares (13.57 acres) from PR - Recreation to RE - Estate Residential in accordance with the Ardrossan Area Structure Plan (ASP).

Recommendations

- 1. THAT Bylaw 11-2021, a bylaw that proposes to rezone approximately 5.49 hectares (13.57 acres) in the SW 11-53-22-W4 from PR Recreation to RE Estate Residential, be given first reading.
- 2. THAT Bylaw 11-2021 be given second reading.

Report

The proposed rezoning is in support of the concurrent Ardrossan Estates Stage 3 subdivision application which proposes the creation of 26 estate residential lots. The proposed lots are consistent with the policy direction of the Medium Lot Residential and Large Lot Residential area of the Ardrossan ASP and the Hamlet Policy Area of the Municipal Development Plan.

The proposed Stage 3 development will require that a development agreement be entered into between the landowner and Strathcona County prior to third reading of Bylaw 11-2021.
