Report

The purpose of the Traffic Safety Advisory Committee (TSAC) is to work with administration to develop and maintain a dialogue about matters of concern related to traffic safety and to assist Council and administration to develop strategies, programs and policies to improve traffic safety and efficiency. Traffic safety in Strathcona County is guided by the Traffic Safety Strategic Plan.

The specific mandate of the Committee is as follows:

- Provide advice and suggestions for opportunities for resident education in traffic safety.
- Recommend traffic safety issues that could benefit from public engagement.
- Provide advice on the development and implementation of traffic safety and efficiency initiatives currently underway in Strathcona County.
- Review and discuss the development of the Rural Road Safety Strategy.
- Review and discuss the development of the Traffic Safety Communication Plan.
- Review and discuss the implementation of the Neighbourhood Traffic Safety Action Plan.

The TSAC consists of two Councillors and seven public members.
