Report

At the October 27, 2020 Organizational Council meeting, the Governance Advisory Committee provided a report to Council regarding matters related to various council committees.

The report included consideration of the expiration date for several council committee bylaws. After considering the report, Council directed Administration to bring forward an amending bylaw that would extend the bylaws of council committees that were to be repealed on July 31, 2021 and directed that the new repeal date be December 31, 2022.

Accordingly, this report recommends three readings of an amending bylaw to extend the repeal date for the bylaws establishing the Accessibility, Seniors, Traffic Safety, and Youth Advisory Committees.

September 25, 2018 Council gave third reading to the Accessibility Advisory Committee

Bylaw, Youth Advisory Committee Bylaw, and Traffic Safety Advisory

Committee Bylaw.
