## **County Definition of Affordable Housing**

Please provide the County's definition of "affordable housing" and share that definition with the Accessibility Advisory Committee.

The County's definition for 'affordable housing' comes from the <u>Canadian Mortgage and Housing</u> <u>Corporation</u> and refers to housing that requires less than 30% of a household's before-tax income. 'Affordable housing' is a broad term that covers the housing continuum from homelessness to market home ownership. It includes housing provided by private, public and non-profit sectors and includes all forms of housing - rental, ownership and co-operative ownership, temporary and permanent housing. In 2016, 14% of households in Strathcona County (4,870 households) were spending 30% or more of household income on housing.

When housing is unaffordable and residents cannot find affordable options, they are said to be in 'core housing need'. Core housing need occurs when a household's dwelling is considered unsuitable, inadequate, or unaffordable, and when household income levels are such that alternative housing is unaffordable. In 2016, 5.5% of households in Strathcona County (1,970 households) were in core housing need.

In 2020, a housing needs and demand report was prepared for Strathcona County with more information about the status of housing in the County. The <u>summary</u> and <u>full report</u> are available on the County's website.
