

Baseline Road and Clover Bar Road History

Please provide any available information on the original design for Baseline Road and Clover Bar Road (e.g. how many lanes was it designed to be at maximum) when Craigavon neighbourhood was approved and any changes that were approved and when they were approved from the original concept back in the 1980s.

Both the 1985 Heritage Hills Area Structure Plan (ASP) and 1987 Craigavon ASP documents note that Baseline Road was planned as a 6-lane arterial roadway with a 55.0m road right-of-way, and that Clover Bar Road (previously named Lakeland Boulevard) was planned as an arterial roadway with a road right-of-way width of 40.0m, which was reflective of the 4-lane cross section at that time.

No changes have been made to the status of these two roads. Baseline Road exists as a 6-lane arterial, and Clover Bar Road is a 4-lane arterial. Over the years, improvements have been made to the intersections to include dual left turn movements, but through travel lanes are still 6-lanes on Baseline Road and 4-lanes on Clover Bar Road.
