
Alberta Airshed model

- Place-based = local oversight over air quality monitoring and reporting.
- Collaborative, multi-stakeholder engagement and consensus-based decision-making.
- Highly skilled and experienced oversight of monitoring activities.
- On-going education and engagement of the community.
- Responsive to local public, government and industry needs.
- Sustainable, committed funding.



Air Monitoring Sites

Continuous Monitoring

- Measure 19 substances and weather conditions
- Operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- Provide real time data
- Report exceedances
- Provide data for Air Quality Health Index



Passive Monitoring

- Measure the monthly average of up to 3 parameters
- Qualitative indicators to determine trends and future monitoring





Sensor Monitoring

- Measures particulate matter and/gasses
- Operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- Provides real time data
- Low cost and easy to move around








Health Risk	Air Quality Health Index	Health Messages	
		At Risk Population*	General Population
Low	1 - 3	Enjoy your usual outdoor activities.	Ideal air quality for outdoor activities.
Moderate	4 - 6	Consider reducing or rescheduling strenuous activities outdoors if you are experiencing symptoms.	No need to modify your usual outdoor activities unless you experience symptoms such as coughing and throat irritation.
High	7 - 10	Reduce or reschedule strenuous activities outdoors. Children and the elderly should also take it easy.	Consider reducing or rescheduling strenuous activities outdoors if you experience symptoms such as coughing and throat irritation.
Very High	Above 10	Avoid strenuous activities outdoors. Children and the elderly should also avoid outdoor physical exertion.	Reduce or reschedule strenuous activities outdoors, especially if you experience symptoms such as coughing and throat irritation.




Air Quality Management

Capital Region Oversight Advisory Committee

- Fort Air Partnership, Alberta Capital Airshed and West Central Airshed included in the North Saskatchewan Region.
- Involved in the Capital Region Oversight Advisory Committee led by Alberta Environment and Parks.
- This committee reports against Canadian Ambient Air Quality Standards using data from monitoring stations in the three Airsheds.
- The Airsheds also support initiatives under the Particulate Matter Response Plan.

Designated Industrial Zone

- To create a unique regulatory framework that provides environmental standards and certain and efficient approval processes that are best in class relative to competing international districts.
- FAP actively participates in the DIZ Air Working Group. The focus of this group is "defining environmental objectives for air quality, setting regional standards for ambient condition, identifying data gaps, and enabling shared knowledge."
- FAP is also developing a long-term monitoring plan, assessing how the current network may need to be expanded or revised to accommodate new development over the next several years.

Criteria for Provincial Designation of Industrial Zones





- 6 Purple Air Sensors




ACA Network

Boundary: 9800 km²


Monitoring Sites:

- 5 continuous stations*
- 1 portable station
- 20 passive sites
- 32 sensor sites

* Not including stations in Refinery Row area, which are industry operated stations



2021 Fort Air Partnership AQHI results




