

2022 Capital Budget Amendment – Hydrogen Bus Shelter

Report Purpose

To amend the 2022 Capital Budget for a change in the scope of work for the hydrogen bus shelter and to accept funding from the Alberta Zero Emission Hydrogen Transit project of \$275,000 to assist with construction costs.

Recommendation

That an amendment to the 2022 Capital Budget to increase the Hydrogen Bus Shelter project in the amount of \$145,000 (from \$180,000 to \$325,000), and to change funding by reducing Municipal Reserves by \$130,000 (from \$180,000 to \$50,000) and adding \$275,000 Third Party (Alberta Zero Emission Hydrogen project) funding, be approved.

Report

Strathcona County is participating in the Alberta Zero Emission Hydrogen Transit (AZEHT) project that will test two hydrogen fuel cell electric buses (FCEB). As part of the project, Strathcona County purchased one of the hydrogen transit buses under the 2022 annual transit fleet replacement program (as a pilot), to determine the effectiveness of the technology in Alberta. The City of Edmonton has purchased the second bus for the project.

Storage is a challenge that has been identified with hydrogen bus technology. As the project team has been working through the options including the purchase of a fabric Quonset option, supply chain issues and construction costs have become a challenge for the project, as well as the impacts of the delays in having the shelter ready.

On July 19, 2022, Council approved \$180,000 from municipal reserves to cover the cost for a fabric Quonset shelter. When the order was being discussed, the delivery times were significantly longer than forecast. This resulted in administration looking for options. One option is to construct a temporary heated, wood-framed shelter constructed on steel piles.

We have priced this work and have a vendor ready to proceed with construction. Based on the cost of construction and the cost of the utilities, the project estimate has increased to \$325,000.

The AZEHT project has confirmed that they will reimburse the County up to \$275,000 based on actual receipts provided for the work. As this funding will come after the work has been paid for, administration is requesting Council approve a budget increase of \$145,000 in addition to the \$180,000 already approved for a total of \$325,000.

The project financial impact for the County is as outlined below.
