

Potential ceremonial road naming costs (Ward 1)

Report Purpose

To provide information to Council regarding potential costs that would be incurred to add John Ashton's name as a ceremonial name to Athabascan Avenue.

Recommendation

THAT the ceremonial road naming of John Ashton Way, as set out in Enclosure 3 of the November 15, 2022, Planning and Development Services report, including the installation of the ceremonial street blades, be approved.

The potential ceremonial naming of Athabascan Avenue, located west of Broadmoor Boulevard would honour John Ashton.

On September 27, 2022, Council approved a motion which added Mr. Ashton's name to the Commemorative Names Registry. As part of the motion, Council requested a report with information on any costs that would be incurred to add the name as a ceremonial name to Athabascan Avenue.

The cost involved in assigning "John Ashton Way" as a ceremonial name would be approximately \$2,500. This would include the additional signage and installation costs for two large signs at the signal on Broadmoor Boulevard as well as six small signs for the three other intersections off of Athabascan Avenue. The cost for the signage and installation will be accommodated in existing budgets.

Sign proofs for the proposed ceremonial naming street blades are included in Enclosure 1.

The ceremonial name change would not have an impact on existing addressing in the area as the official name of Athabascan Avenue would be maintained.
