

2023 Operating Budget Amendment - Transit Workforce Management Software

Report Purpose

To amend the 2023 Operating Budget to support the Transit Workforce Management Software project.

Recommendation

THAT an amendment to the 2023 Operating Budget to increase funding for the implementation of the Transit Workforce Management Software in the amount \$270,000, to be funded from Municipal Reserves, be approved.

Report

In September 2022, Council approved repurposing funds from the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program: COVID-19 Resilience Stream to support a new project: Transit Workforce Management Software. The Transit Workforce Management Software project received federal approval in February 2023. The project must be completed by December 2024.

The County has gone through a significant amount of change since the go-live of Oracle in July 2022. In addition, there have been significant learnings in the payroll module of Oracle which went live in October 2022. Due to these factors, additional resources are required to successfully complete the Transit Workforce Management Software project.

The requested resources total \$270,000:

- 1. Additional IT support \$113,500
- 2. Additional Human Resources support \$78,000
- 3. Additional Business Excellence support \$62,500
- 4. Additional software license \$16,000

Most of these costs are ineligible under the grant funding as the resources are current County contract staff. Any overhead costs, including salaries and other employee benefits of any employees, are ineligible under the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program.

If these additional costs are not approved, the successful implementation of Transit Workforce Management Software is at risk due to limited staff resources.

This project supports Strathcona County's goal of Municipal Excellence: Strathcona County is a leading municipality that moves the community forward through service excellence delivered by engaged and empowered employees.
