Bid process and timeline

• Strathcona County submitted a letter of interest for the bid to host the 2026 Alberta Summer Games.

Timeline

- Bid due August 31, 2023
- Site tour September 2023
- Games awarded November 2023





About the games

- Provides an opportunity for athletes ages 11 17 to compete in a multi-sport event and reach their athletic potential.
- The 4-day long Games welcome up to 2,500 athletes, coaches, officials and chaperones and require 1,500 volunteers to support the program.
- Based on recent games, the event provides a regional economic impact of approximately \$2.1 million.





- Requires the use of Strathcona County and partner facilities. Costs to Strathcona County are estimated to be \$1.9 million.
- Final budget will be included in the Bid Package due August 31, 2023.
- Host municipalities receive a \$420,000 operating grant. The Games may be eligible for additional grants or casino funds. Other revenue would be from sponsorships and Municipal support.
- Partnership has been confirmed with Elk Island Schools as both the athletes' village and sport hosts.



Organizing the games

- The Alberta Games are coordinated by a Games Organizing Committee.
- Mayor and Council of the host community is required to select a Games Chairperson, and the Games Chairperson, with input from the municipal council, will choose the Board of Directors.
