Report

As we continue to mature in our Asset Management journey, it's imperative that we establish our core competencies within Asset Management. Asset Management as a discipline within Alberta, looks to both Infrastructure Asset Management Alberta (IAMA) and Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) for maturity criteria and core competencies.

One of those core competencies that is identified nationally, is having an approved Asset Management Policy.

Over the last year, administration has worked to develop an Asset Management Policy that articulates our core principles that were shared with Council last year, but also meets an industry standard that is seen across Canada.

An approved Asset Management Policy will achieve a core competency set out by FCM but will also signal our commitment to Asset Management to our community. Future funding opportunities will require that we have an approved policy to be approved for funding. This is something that has been shared both at the provincial and federal funding levels.

Our maturity journey doesn't stop at the policy level, as we will then need to develop asset management plans for our various asset categories that will individually speak to the core principles within the policy; and how that relates to the various asset categories and the services we provide our community.
