Arts and Culture Grants

Arts, Culture and Heritage Community Investment Program

Deadlines: November 1 and May 8

Arts Development/Program/Project	Applicants may apply for up to \$5,000
Capital Equipment	Up to 50% cost of equipment. Max. \$5,000
Individual Artist Development	Max of \$750.00 for emerging artists and up to \$1,500 for professional artists
Organizational Development	Applicants may apply for up to \$2,000
Special Event or Festival Grant	Applicants may apply for up to \$5,000

Funds must be spent in the year they are awarded.

- Application demand has increased by 105% since 2013.
- 2020/21 saw a decrease in applications due to COVID shutdowns
 - COVID emergency funding of up to \$5,000 offered to community groups to offset costs and reduced revenues.





Evaluation Process

- Jury committee of three to five members from the arts, culture and heritage communities evaluate the following:
 - ✓ Clearly articulated plan/need
 - ✓ Community value
 - ✓ Availability to all County residents
 - ✓ Lack of overlap with existing services

- ✓ Viability of the project
- ✓ Marketing and promotion strategy
- ✓ Organizational competence
- ✓ Collaborations with other nonprofit groups are seen as a strength
- Organizations whose primary purpose is for the delivery or development of arts, heritage and/or cultural activities in Strathcona County will receive higher priority.



Other RPC Grants for Culture

Culture organizations/groups are also encouraged to apply for the **Community Large Scale Event Investment Program**, as their special event/festival scales to accommodate larger audiences.(1,000+)

- Funding: matches 50% event budget, up to a max of \$15,000
- In 2022, Culture groups received a total of \$20,000 for their large-scale events.

- Proponent of screen industry successfully brought a Netflix series to Sherwood Park in March 2022





COVID

- □ Who would have guessed that singing could become a dangerous activity???
- Shut down for 1.5 years
- Special singers masks, distanced and sanitized when we reconvened with 22 singers (about 50% less)
- Made singing difficult but people wanted to return
- □ Back to 36 members for the 2022-2023 season



Looking Ahead

- Grow our membership, especially male singers
- Challenges:
 - □ Rising expenses
 - ☐ Finding a stable rehearsal site due to the cost of Festival Place
 - Obtaining concert dates at Festival Place
- Key Dates:

- Our connection with the community strengthens our programs and creates wonderful cultural relationships
- We are more than just a writer's circle we embrace and encourage creative growth, not only for our own members, but anyone who loves the written word
