South Strathcona County Functional Planning Study

Report Purpose

To provide the Priorities Committee with the final report for the South Strathcona County Functional Planning Study.

Report

This functional planning study is a guideline for long-term road development within the study area. The study analyzed projected traffic movements throughout the study area and provided road upgrade recommendations accordingly. The majority of traffic volume is being generated from the proposed City of Edmonton Decoteau Neighbourhood and is traveling to both Highway 14 and Highway 21 which are under the jurisdiction of Alberta Transportation and Economic Corridors. This study used multiple assumptions in achieving its recommendations.

- 1. Projected traffic volumes includes Decoteau projected traffic volumes, Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board traffic data and Strathcona County average traffic growth.
- 2. Land use provided by Planning and Development Services Department.
- 3. Long-term highway access due to the lack of planning studies on both Highway 15 and Highway 21, the study assumed status quo access to both highways.

Should any of these assumptions change in the future, an update to the study will be required.

The main recommendations are as follows:

- Upgrades to four rail crossings due to higher-than-desired skew angle between the road and the railway tracks
- Upgrade Township Road 510 reprofiling and a section to Class 1
- Upgrade Township Road 512 from Class 1 20m ROW to Class 1 40m ROW
- Upgrade Township Road 514 Class 1 reprofiling
- Upgrade Range Road 231 reprofiling and a section to Class 1 40m ROW
- Upgrade Range Road 232 reprofiling and a small section to Class 1 40m ROW
- Other roads and service roads were generally reprofiling
