This includes Firefighters and Officers, with the exception of Medicine Hat, which only reflects Firefighters and does not include Officer ranks.

The ratio of Firefighter to population is only one consideration in defining the appropriate number of firefighters and stations required to provide the appropriate fire protection to a community. Every community must consider its risk profile. (density, physical makeup, heavy industry, multi family, highrises, highway systems and dangerous goods corridors). These factors must be taken into consideration when determining fire suppression needs as well as other vital factors such as population growth, response times, first due apparatus (time it takes for the first truck to arrive) and effective response force (the appropriate number of firefighters required to complete critical tasks)
