


Food Insecurity in Strathcona County - it's real

Everyone deserves to eat, and everyone has a right to nutritious, appropriate food.



The Social Impacts of Food Security


Recent research shows that every dollar donated to food banks can save society \$9.84*.










Food Provision

We have a responsibility to provide the healthiest food possible.

- 641 hampers provided monthly (average)
- Our monthly hampers now provide 7 days of a nutritionally balanced diet, plus an additional 7 days of sustenance
- Weekly/biweekly food supplies for area agencies
- Mini pantry with FCS and ARC
- Hours expansion (Thursday evening and Saturday)
- Choice area moving to shopping model enhances dignity and cultural preference





Volunteer & Community Engagement

34,300 hours volunteered in 2023 by over 200 County citizens

- Over 200 regular volunteers weekly+ shifts
- 8 dedicated Board members bring **245+ years** of professional/board experience
 - plus 12 skilled team leads
- Special events in the community
- Group & corporate work bees
- Strong community support with donations (large and small) and food drives





Food Rescue

Food insecurity is not caused by a shortage of food.

- Rescued over 200,000 pounds of good food in 2023
 - Strong relationships with food retailers in Strathcona County – our truck picks up daily
 - Glean what we can use
 - Love Food Program with Salisbury Composite to repurpose foods destined for farmer or landfill
 - Part of Waste Diversion Pilot with County

Our New Facility – The Nourish Centre



- Project Timeline break ground Q2 2025 and move in target Q2 2026
- Have an active offer to purchase land in Sherwood Park
- Ready to move to detailed construction documents (Kasian has been retained)
- High Level Project Budget is \$5.0M
 - Funded from SFB strategic reserves, capital fundraising, grants (including CFEP), and conventional mortgage debt



What we need from Council







- Acknowledgement of the important role SFB plays in Strathcona County & endorsement of our plans
- Letters of support for CFEP small (immediate) and CFEP large in spring 2025
- Direct financial support for our facility, or in-kind facility supports, valuing **\$250,000** per year for 3 years
