


CSWB collaborative communications campaign

Campaign Goal: Raise awareness about CSWB and our partners in the community

Strategy: Work collaboratively with the members of the Stewardship Committee to highlight their involvement and the key priorities of CSWB

Timeframe: September 16 to October 28, 2024

Format: Led by Family and Community Services, supported by CSWB Stewardship Committee members





CSWB campaign evaluation

Early indicators: Positive feedback from partners and strong participation, including requests for additional printed material

Strathcona County campaign statistics:

- 213 posters in the community
- 300 window decals in the community
- 119,244 impressions on social media
- 85 shares on social media
- 909 webpage visits

Note: Currently conducting a full campaign evaluation with the Stewardship Committee





CSWB action reports

- New CSWB tool launched in February 2024, and published biannually
- Showcases initiatives and programs that make important contributions to community safety and well-being in Strathcona County



- E-newsletter format and available on CSWB webpage
- 540 views on website between February 28 to November 6, 2024
- Builds awareness of resources across partners, captures impacts of new CSWB partnerships, and supports CSWB evaluation

Strategic Priority: **Basic Needs**




Ultimate Outcome:

All community members have their basic needs met




Current state analysis: alignment with priorities

- Communication plan projected to launch in early 2025

Use social prescribing model to support underserved groups


Extreme weather response
