- This team will steward the ongoing success of the Agricultural Framework.

- Researched and documented content: strategic alignment, legislative duties, trends, storytelling, outcomes and objectives




Agricultural Framework: themes

GOVERNANCE AND AGRICULTURE – Cultivate agriculture throughout government process, policy, and regulation to sustain livelihoods and lifestyles

- 1) Perform legislative duties and ensure compliance under the applicable provincial legislation, including the Agricultural Service Board Act (ASBA), Agricultural Pests Act (APA), Animal Health Act (AHA), Soil Conservation Act (SCA), Weed Control Act (WCA) and the Water Act (WA).
- Enhance the promotion of Strathcona County's agricultural and food interests to advocacy and government groups.
- Develop and maintain municipal policies and regulations that foster the agriculture sector while balancing the needs of the municipality.
- 4) Support the predictability of the agricultural land base in Strathcona County through thoughtful governance.



- 1) Address current agricultural priorities with the timely extension of relevant best management practices in accordance with municipal responsibilities under provincial legislation.
- 2) Promote the stewardship of the County's natural resources and the environment in the process of food production.
- 3) Nurture the diversification of the agricultural industry by delivering pertinent extension materials.
- 4) Foster urban agriculture by facilitating the development of the necessary infrastructure and the promotion and delivery of educational content to increase the skills of residents.
- 5) Consider agriculture as a primary user group in infrastructure planning, management, and upgrades within agricultural areas to sustain continued production and delivery to markets.


