Council History

June 24, 2014 - Council approved funding necessary to construct the Emerald Hills Leisure Centre with an anticipated opening in the fall of 2016.

Summary

- The Emerald Hills Leisure Centre was designed and constructed to meet identified community needs derived from the Open Space Recreation Facility Strategy (OSRFS), Aquatic Strategy. The needs identified were:
 - 1. Learn to swim lessons;
 - 2. Lap swimming and aquatic fitness;
 - 3. Swim club lanes;
 - 4. Rehabilitation/therapy; and
 - 5. Recreational space for zero to six years old.
- Construction of the Emerald Hills Leisure Centre is on schedule for Strathcona County to receive occupancy June 30th. For the following 90 days, Recreation, Parks and Culture and other departments are required to undertake the rigors of commissioning, permitting, staff training, building and operational systems validation and testing operational practices.
- The grand opening is planned for Saturday, October 1, 2016 with more information to follow.
