The Beaver Hills Watershed Stewardship Society is an environmental organization committed to the restoration and preservation of the watershed within the UNESCO designated Biosphere of the Beaver Hills. We are a community based organization run by volunteers and we value our connections with our community members. As we work toward our objectives within the watershed, it is very important that we maintain our community connections. We have a presence on social media for that purpose in addition to an existing website. Unfortunately, our current website is hosted on a platform that has open source coding. This open source platform carries with it potential for security breaches, loss of data and limited data storage capabilities.

As part of our objective toward the restoration and preservation of the wetlands, we conduct scientific research to gather significant amounts of data including water quality, water levels, waterway mapping and eDNA testing. As our organization undertakes these projects, we need to be able to share the results of these projects on an attractive, easy to use and secure platform that will provide current and evolving information to members of the public. Projects that will be started within the next year include a complex study of detailed mapping of the watershed showing both historical water routes and the state of current water routes. This mapping will include complicated graphics and overleafs with significant data around water levels and water quality. The mapping project will serve as a base upon which we can implement a plan for long term restoration objectives within the watershed. These long-term objectives include riparian zone restorations, education programs around the importance of wetlands within a watershed to local landowners and members of the public in addition to projects to protect endangered species within the watershed with a focus on the Western Tiger Salamander. As we gather our data and work toward our objectives, it is extremely important that we have a stable and secure platform for our organization that will allow us to share the results of our projects and connect better with members of our community.

Through recommendations from other organizations with similar needs and objectives, we have selected Box Clever as a website development organization who can create a functional and engaging website for our organization. They are a local business within our community (Sherwood Park) and they have successfully created websites for other non-profit and environmentally focused organizations such as the Beaver Hills Biosphere, Land Stewardship Centre and North Saskatchewan Watershed Alliance. Our intent is to create a platform that is clean and efficient to clearly carry our message to the public. We want this forum to be easy to use and allow our members, other non-governmental organizations and people living within the watershed to easily access information about the projects that we are undertaking. Box Clever also brings security controls to their websites through their proprietary source code and data storage to ensure that both the organization and the users of our website are protected. The platform would be upgraded as needed to support modern browsers but will also provide fallback styles for older or less advanced browsers ensuring that we

maintain a wide scope of contact for the diverse members of our community. The website will have large data capabilities enabling the safe storage of data and it will convert that data into attractive easy to view images and documents for members of the public. The website will be comprised of attractive pictures, videos and graphics that we have already created through our own videography and drone footage to help us to tell the story of the watershed and to track our progress on our projects. This website will also enhance our organizational abilities through the inclusion of project management modules so that we can be accountable to our members and ensure they have current information on the work that our organization is doing.

Through the sharing of our organization's mandate and mission on an attractive easy to use platform we hope to build both our membership and volunteer base. This hub will be central to our ability to protect, conserve and restore the Beaver Hills Watershed.

The proposal from Box Clever for development of the website platform is \$9,500. We have funding sourced through the Land Stewardship Center to support our regular outreach and science projects this year but nothing at the level required to achieve this high priority growth objective.

The BriarPatch Childcare Cottage is a new initiative for Strathcona County. A Registered Non-Profit, the Cottage was created to provide a unique and family focused centre for daily childcare, and family supports. We are creating a Food Garden in our new fenced in play area that will provide 3 options for food delivery:

* enhance our daily food program for our children on site - fresh vegetables the children have actively learned to grow and nurture throughout the Summer and into the Fall.

* provide fresh food to the families in our childcare program who are currently experiencing food insecurity. This is a confidential ask from our families directly to me and our Food Garden Coordinator. Food will be provided discretely to those families who request support from us through the Summer and into the Fall.

* the most exciting part of the Food Garden Project is the opportunity for our children to learn about giving back to the Community. A portion of the fresh food grown on site will be donated to the Strathcona County Food Bank. This part of our initiative will instill in our young children on site that the giving hearts they each have will now extend beyond our walls (and our garden!) to the families in our region who are without fresh food at times. The families and our Team members are so excited for this piece of the project as a way for their children to learn about giving back and supporting others.

Our BriarPatch Childcare Cottage Food Garden Project has been approved by both our Licencing Officer for the childcare centre and by Alberta Health Services in our County.

We are so fortunate to have the support of the United Way's Heartland Challenge to complete our outdoor play space and to create the Food Garden Project. They are funding the build part and providing volunteers

and staff to oversee this project. However, with our limited budget and what they can provide, we do not have enough in our funding together to purchase the

BriarPatch Childcare Cottage Community Food Garden Project Justification for Requested Funds

The BriarPatch Childcare Cottage, located at #21, 301 Wye Road in Sherwood Park, opened as a Non-Profit Centre on December 2, 2024. This unique concept for childcare includes community programming and family involvement, along with Early Learning and Development, Early Literacy and engaged play for all.

Part of our philosophy of care with our children in our care and their families is to provide opportunities for engagement with the community at large. As we registered our families, we began to see that families in our region are struggling with a number of social issues, including food insecurity in our current economy. As we would explore with them their options for support, some expressed concern about accessing programming they felt was only for those in dire need. With this in mind, as we began to design our outdoor play garden for childcare, we decided to include space to build a community garden, with 3 intentional plans in mind. These intentional plans are as follows:

- 1. To have our littles in our care learn about gardening and the benefits of eating fresh vegetables daily. From planning our garden, to starting seeds inside, to moving them to a greenhouse, and then transplanting in the garden boxes, our children will learn about how to be responsible for growing their own food. The second part is for children to watch their vegetables grow, to nurture them through the weather, and to harvest them as they become ready for eating. Some of the vegetables we grow will be included in our Food Program during the day with our littles.
- 2. To have families with children in our care take home some of the fresh produce to supplement their own food budget. The pride our littles will have in helping to grow food that their family will also eat is part of the process of helping families recognize they can access food sources locally. The families who choose to accept some of our fresh produce will provide some volunteer time in the garden as well. A community project for our families.
- 3. To supply our local Strathcona County Food Bank with some of our fresh veggies for their clients. We recognize the great need this amazing community organization has for fresh veggies, and we are excited to be able to provide what we grow to local families beyond our doors. This will also benefit our children who will be growing the veggies to share as well.

We trust this information will help County Council see the benefits in this project and support our initiative for our children as well as our community at large.

Justification for a request for Community Benefit Funding for the asphalt paving of the entrance to Colchester Cemetery

Colchester Cemetery (www.colchestercemetery.com) is a 127-year-old *Strathcona County designated heritage site* located at the corner of Twp Rd 521A and RR 233.

History:

In the late 1800's, a local settler donated an acre from his farm to be used as a cemetery for the benefit of the local community. The Bishop of Rupert's Land consecrated it as a cemetery site in 1898. Although it received the remains of many local families' members, it was eventually abandoned for over 70 years. In 1986, St. Thomas Anglican parish (Sherwood Park) agreed to assume responsibility for its operations and maintenance.

Current Status

Since then, a **Colchester Cemetery Committee** composed of volunteers from the Sherwood Park community, has restored the cemetery, and now operates it as a *non-profit, charitable organization* (through the Anglican church). The Committee oversees all plots sales, interments, monument installations, grounds maintenance and improvements to the property.

Strathcona County has no municipal cemetery. Colchester Cemetery is ecumenical in nature and open to anyone regardless of religion, race, sexual orientation or past behaviour. Because Colchester Cemetery has always offered very affordable pricing, it has become a preferred, noncommercial cemetery choice for County residents.

The Case for Funding

As a result, vehicle traffic into the cemetery has increased significantly thereby deteriorating its only dirt and gravel driveway entrance off Twp Rd 521A. The driveway is badly in need of upgrading, preferably with a small apron of asphalt. Quotes for this project were requested and received from two small, local construction companies with the lowest bid received at \$8,478 (see attached). The Committee has agreed to pay \$2,000 from its Operating Fund towards the project costs but would like funding assistance from Strathcona County for the balance of \$6,478.

As Colchester Cemetery is located within Strathcona County Ward 6, Counsellor Corey-Ann Hartwick was approached and asked to assist the Committee with its request. She suggested that the project might be eligible for Community Benefit Funding and suggested the Committee complete a Benefit Funding application form. Project Description

Optipemisiwak (formerly Metis nation of Alberta) will be celebrating the Anniversary of 25 years of ownership of the land and St. Margaret's Church. We are having an event on July 13, 2025 to celebrate the milestone at North Cooking Lake Hall and there will also be a Mass at the Church as part of the celebration. The church itself is a little-known treasure, even though it is both a Provincial and Strathcona County Historic Resource. The rich history behind the cemetery and church are not well known, with few resources to access it. Our organization currently has two brochures; one for the Church and Cemetery and one to promote venue rentals such as weddings and funerals to help offset operating costs. Both of these were created almost a decade ago and the supply of materials has run out and the information is outdated. We would like funding to redesign both and print about 250 brochures for each.
